## New Students

Students who enrolled as of Academic Year 2020/2021 must follow the prescribed course of study and sequence given for their programme.

## Continuing Students

Students are required to successfully, complete all courses in Year 1 before they can proceed to undertake courses in Year 2. Please continue to follow the prescribed course of study given.

## Advice For Managing Course Load

Most students carry between 1 – 3 courses per semester. **For the working adult**, we recommend that you **do not attempt more than three (3) courses** per semester and two (2) courses in summer.

Plan wisely to suit your particular situation so you may perform at your full potential. Do not jeopardize your long-term goals by being unrealistic about what you can handle.

## IMPORTANT NOTE for New Students

Orientation is the first step to achieving academic and personal success at the UWI Open Campus. It supports you by assisting with your transition to the online environment. It will equip you with the needed navigational skills to function successfully online and provide pertinent information about the available services, go to persons and responsibilities as an online student. It is imperative that you attend the online sessions offered by the Programme Delivery Department (PDD) as well as the session offered at your local site office.

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Youth development is being given greater international priority in recognition of the significant role that young people currently play, and will continue to play in the achievement of national, regional and international development goals. Major international meetings now create spaces for young people to participate in decision-making and for devising strategies to resolve the challenges which young people face.

The recognition of youth as key partners in development, acknowledges, on the one hand, the right of young people to participate and, on the other hand, the responsibility of societies to ensure the complete development and empowerment of youth so that, as future leaders, they can dedicate themselves to pursuing the political, cultural and socio-economic advancement of their societies.

By combining distinctive elements of **Youth Development Work** with that of Management Studies students will be given the option of pursuing a programme which will prepare them for their intended career path and also cater to their personal interests.

This **BSc in Youth Development Work with Minor in Management Studies** is designed to offer prospective students a rich theoretical and practical experience in youth development work, as well as developing and strengthening their management capabilities and competencies.

The structure of the BSc Youth Development Work with Minor in Management Studies reflects progression of intellectual growth and promotes student success. The courses at Level 1 are foundation and introductory level courses. Levels II and III of the programme comprise the courses offered in the Youth Development Work (Major), the Management Studies (Minor), and the Free Electives. All courses in this proposed structure are drawn from the Open Campus' existing undergraduate programmes in Youth Development Work and Management Studies in particular, as well as from the Sociology and Psychology programmes for the Free Electives.

**The BSc in Youth Development Work with Minor in Management Studies programme** operates under a semester system.

- Semester 1 and 2 each, have thirteen (13) weeks of instruction plus an examination period.
- Summer session has seven (7) weeks of instruction plus the examination period.

## Pre-requisites for Matriculation into the BSc Youth Development Work with Minor in Management Studies Programme

- **Mathematics Requirements:** For entry to the Undergraduate programmes, an approved qualification in Mathematics is required. The minimum Mathematics requirement is a pass at CSEC or the equivalent. Candidates who do not meet this requirement must successfully complete the approved remedial Mathematics course Improving your Math Skills (IYMS1001). IYMS1001 is offered in semester 1, 2 and summer.
- **English Language Requirements:** The English Language Proficiency Test (ELPT) is used to assess whether applicants to the Undergraduate programmes possess a satisfactory level of writing and reading proficiency in English for university academic purposes. ELPT is a pre-requisite for FOUN1001: English for Academic Purposes. For those persons requiring ELPT, the exam schedule is posted by the Registry on the Department's Web Page at: <http://www.open.uwi.edu/undergraduate/home>. Also, check your site office for more details. The earliest offering of ELPT is TBD.
- **Technology Requirement:** Students will need to have access to a computer with Internet access.
